
IN RE: Declaration of Excess Police Property and Transfer to Other Governmental Office


WHEREAS, the Sugarcreek Township Police Department has identified equipment which is no longer needed for operations, and;


WHEREAS, the Police Department equipment is identified as a 2005 Ford Crown Victoria Police Interceptor, VIN number 2FAFP71W85X137347 that is in not being used as an active patrol vehicle and is in reserve, and;

WHEREAS, this vehicle has an individual value of less than the repair cost to make it roadworthy for service,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that this Sugarcreek Township Board of Trustees hereby declares this vehicle to be excess and, contingent upon notification of acceptance by the Spring Valley Board of Trustees, directs its transfer to the Spring Valley Fire Department once all decals, the VHF, and the 800 radios are removed.

The Police Department has a 2005 Ford Crown Victoria Police Interceptor in the inventory. (VIN 2FAFP71W85X137347) The cruiser has over 100K on it and it is not being used as an active patrol vehicle and is in reserve. All of the emergency equipment that is installed in the cruiser is 10 years old or older, obsolete and no longer supported by the manufacturer.

I have been advised that when the new cruisers were ordered, the dealer was not interested in a trade-in because of age and mileage.

I request that this vehicle be transferred to the Spring Valley Fire Department that has expressed the need for it. The VHF, the 800 radios, and "POLICE" decals will be removed in-house before disposal.

We have a 2005 Ford Crown Victoria Police Interceptor in the inventory. (VIN 2FAFP71W85X137347)

The cruiser has over 100K on it and it is not being used as an active patrol vehicle at this time. It has not been used for some time. All of the emergency equipment that is installed in the cruiser is 10 years old or older and many replacement repair parts are no longer available or very expensive and difficult to find. This includes the light bar, secondary ER lighting, switch box components and siren system. These items will stay with the vehicle. I will remove the VHF and the 800 radios. The "POLICE" decals will also be removed in-house.


We certainly could use the parking space and we can remove it from the maintenance schedule to reduce those costs. I try to drive it every two weeks to keep it from deteriorating further.

I also inquired about a trade-in against the new cruisers that have been ordered. The dealer was not interested because the car was over five years old and had over 100K on it. To them it really had no value. However, it might be of use to another agency.

With these factors in mind, I recommend that we retire this car and perhaps consider an inter-governmental transfer to another public safety agency.
