
IN RE: Resignation of Part-time Safer Grant Firefighter/EMT Kristopher J. Denlinger

WHEREAS, Firefighter Kristopher J. Denlinger has submitted his letter of resignation from the Sugarcreek Township Fire Department; and,


WHEREAS, Mr. Denlinger has been a member of the Sugarcreek Township Fire Department since October 18, 2010, and,


