WHEREAS, Firefighter Anthony R. Cascio has submitted his letter of resignation from the Sugarcreek Township Fire Department; and,


WHEREAS, Mr. Cascio has been a member of the Sugarcreek Township Fire Department since January 4, 2010, and,
