Board of Zoning Appeals Activities:

- June 27, 2019 BZA Meeting Follow-Up:
 - <u>BZA04-2019</u>: Applicant, Jonathan Elmeier, is requesting a variance from Section 4.13 C. 10. a. of the Sugarcreek Township Zoning Resolution to allow for the construction of a basketball court in the rear yard closer to the side property line than otherwise permitted. The subject property is 4366 Napa Valley Drive, parcel L32000100030022100, owned by Jonathan and Vivian Elmeier, and located in the R-1B (Suburban Residential-Moderate) District.
 - The BZA approved the applicant's request.
 - **BZA05-2019:** Applicant, Tom's Mulch and Landscape, is requesting Conditional Use Approval under Section 4.08 C. Table 4-3 to allow for the construction of entry gates at their Ferry Road and Waynesville Road entrances. The subject property is located at the northwest corner of Ferry and Waynesville Roads with an address of Ferry Road (directly east of 2107 Ferry Road), parcel L32000100110008700, owned by Ferry Road Investments LLC, containing 4.591 acres, and located in the I-1 (Industrial) and W-P (Well Field Protection) Districts.
 - The BZA approved the applicant's request.
- July 25, 2019 BZA Meeting:
 - <u>BZA 06-2019</u>: Applicants, Patrick and Karen Bachelder, are requesting a variance from Section 4.11 G. Table 4-4 of the Sugarcreek Township Zoning Resolution to allow for the construction of a single-family home with a front

yard setback of approximately 38' from the property line adjacent to Paxon Drive. The subject property is 1033 Staylit Court, parcel L32000100130040800, owned by Patrick and Karen Bachelder, and located in the R-1A (Suburban Residential-Low) District.
